Summary Care Plan

When to Call Us:

- Anytime you have a question or are unsure what to do.
- If his **blood sugar does not rise after a low treatment** (is still below 4.0 when re-checked 15 minutes after a low treatment is given).
- If (child's name) vomits, or is unable to eat after he has received insulin.
- If (child's name) is very drowsy, loses consciousness or is convulsing (severe low blood sugar). Call 9-1-1 first.
- If the pump alarms. (So we can troubleshoot.)
- If **blood sugar is over #**. (This is not urgent unless he is also vomiting.)

When To Check Blood Sugar:

- Any time you are worried his blood sugar may be low (he shows symptoms of low blood sugar).
- Before snack time
- Before/after gym class (or other exercise, more than 15 mins of moderate intensity)

What To Do after Blood Sugar Check:

If (child's name)'s blood sugar is:

- Over XX.0 → (fill in what you want them to do: call you? Supervise your child giving an insulin dose?)
 - * Results of cognitively-demanding tasks (including tests) done at this time will not accurately reflect (child's name)'s ability, as cognitive ability is affected by high blood sugar).
- $X X \rightarrow (fill in what you want them to do, including "nothing" if that is the case).$
 - * If blood sugar is in the 4's, and snack time is more than 15 mins away, please allow (child's name) to have his snack early.
- Below 4.0 → Fast-acting carbohydrates, #g (= ONE package marked "Low Treatment")

Ex. # gummie worm, # Skittles candies, # Glucose tablets, # Large Rocket candies

- Low treatments located: Low Kit in desk, his waist belt, in gym, library
- * NO insulin given
- * Make sure (child's name) consumes ALL of the contents of the package.
- * (child's name) should re-check his blood sugar 15 minutes later (to make sure it is rising).
- * If blood sugar is still below 4.0, repeat low treatment as above and **CONTACT US**:

- * When his blood sugar is below 4.0, (child's name) should not be:
 - physically active
 - left alone (ex. to walk to the bathroom)
 - expected to complete cognitive tasks (including tests)

If (child's name) is very drowsy, non-responsive but STILL CONSCIOUS:

- Give TWO pre-measured packages (# g) of fast-acting carbohydrate immediately
- Firmly coax (child's name) to eat or drink.

If (child's name) is **UNCONSCIOUS**/convulsing:

- Call 9-1-1 first. Tell them: a child with <u>type 1 diabetes</u> is having a <u>severe low</u> blood sugar (unconscious, convulsing).
- Call us immediately after (as above)
